Sightseeing & Activities

Surrounding Park Street are some of the most intricate and impressive architectural feats in Bristol. It is difficult to ignore the sheer magnificence of the Wills Memorial Building seated atop Park Street or simply pass by the splendour of Bristol Cathedral.

Discover the rich historical background of Bristol at the Red Lodge Museum or plunge further back in time at Bristol Museum, filled with objects ranging from Ancient Egyptian artefacts to sea dinosaurs! Bristol Museum also houses an impressive art gallery filled with pieces from Bellini, Hepworth and even Banksy.

Art lovers can revel further at the Royal West of England Academy, a gallery dedicated to high profile exhibitions.

Dotted around Park Street are Bristol's most established music venues, including St. George's Concert Hall, the Victoria Rooms, Colston Hall and the O2 Academy.

After uncovering all that Park Street has to offer, take the chance to relax on the lush grass of College Green or watch the sunset on Brandon Hill.



Directions & Travel



Connecting the city centre to Clifton, it couldn't be easier to get to Park Street:

By foot/bicycle: A 10 minute walk or 5 minute cycle ride from the city centre.

By bus: A short trip across the city on services 1, 8, 9, 40, 41 or 54, or take the City Sightseeing tour bus.

By train: A 20 minute bus ride (services 8 or 9) or ferry boat cruise from Bristol Temple Meads station.

By Park & Ride: From one of the three locations: A4 Portway (service 902), Long Ashton (service 903), A4 Bath Road (service 904).

By car: A five minute walk from Trenchard Street, College Street or Prince Street car parks.
